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### 異象與使命

從廿世紀末至廿一世紀初,神在中國及 普世華人中,陸續地興起福音與宣教的事 工。在亞洲和北美,有許多愛主且願意委 身全職或帶職服事神的信徒,他們需要在 真理、生命、事奉與宣教事工上接受進深 且實用的裝備,以致更被神使用。在2005 年的夏天,一群事奉主的牧長和神學院教 授,為回應這廣大的福音禾場上的需要, 在神的帶領下成立了「美國華人福音神學院」,或簡稱「美福神學院」(ACES)。美 福神學院的目的是藉著聖經教導,靈命栽 培,事奉裝備來塑造成熟的國度人才,去 遵行主耶穌基督所吩附的大使命。

美福神學院在美國加州政府下註冊為非 牟利的基督教機構。學院的目標如下:

- 建立靈命成熟的基督徒為主耶穌的僕人;
- 裝備信徒投身中國和海外宣教事工;
- 裝備信徒成為教會牧養與教導的領袖;
- 出版多種媒體,書籍刊物供應各種教導事工的需要。

美福神學院的核心價值是:自由、負 責、尊重、真實、服務。這五個價值指導 美福大家庭的相處和行事。

美福神學院自 2010年夏季開始‧經美國聯邦政府移民局(U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services‧簡稱 USCIS)授權‧可頒發證件 I-20‧正式接受國際學生入讀。

### 基本信仰

美福神學院持守和宣認的基本信仰如 下:

- 1. 我們相信只有一位真神·永恆存在於三個位格中·就是:聖父、聖子、聖靈。
- 2. 我們相信父神是全能、全知、全愛、全 義的神。祂是萬物的創造主,也保育萬 有。
- 3. 我們相信主耶穌基督是神·藉童貞女而生,也是完全無罪的。我們相信祂的神蹟是真實的:祂死在十架上、流血、成了贖罪祭,之後從死裡復活,升到父神的右邊,將來祂必要親身再來。
- 4. 我們相信聖靈是三一神中的一位,與 聖父及聖子一同永恆存在。聖靈現今的 工作是要榮耀主耶穌基督,並且內住信 徒,引領、教導、賜予他們能力。聖靈 也要在罪惡、在公義、在審判方面指證 世人的罪。我們對過份的靈恩表現持保 守的態度。
- 5. 我們相信聖經:它的原本是無誤的,是 神所默示的,把神要向人啟示的心意完 整的記載下來,能以使人得救。聖經是 基督徒信仰和行為之神聖及最高標準。
- 6. 人本是按神的形像和樣式被造的,但犯罪沉淪。所以,全人類是失喪的,唯有悔改、相信耶穌基督,藉聖靈的重生方能得救,得著永遠的生命。
- 7. 教會是一個身體·由一切聖靈重生的人 組成·而基督是元首。基督差遣了教會 去向世人作見證·傳福音·使萬民做門 徒·教導他們遵行一切我們主耶穌所吩 咐的。
- 將來義人與不義的人的身體都會復活。
   義的將復活得永生,不義的將復活被審 判。

### 院舍地點及設備

「美福神學院」座落於美國北加州三藩 市南部之Sunnyvale市、位於灣區 (Bay Area) 矽谷之中心地带。市内高科技公 司林立,有多個購物商場,交通十分方 便。101及237公路就在附近,到聖荷西 (San Jose) 國際機場只需15分鐘,而往 三藩市國際機場約需30分鐘。

校舍位於 Stewart Drive 一座七千三百 方呎的建築物,設有辦公室、圖書館、課 室、電鋼琴教室、禮堂、廚房等。室外停 車場有停車位一百多個,方便學生前來上 課。圖書館藏書約一萬冊,至今不斷添購 新書。

學院的老師同學可免費使用鄰近 Santa Clara 市立圖書館和 Santa Clara University 大學圖書館。若付費用,更可使用鄰 近 Stanford University 和 Saint Patrick Seminary 的豐富藏書。

學院備有兩棟學生宿舍,可供單人或家 庭入住。

### 海外官教

本院於 2018年開始 , 與「北美路加醫 療傳道會」合作,在孟加拉首都達卡的貧 民區有免費醫療和社區服務的短宣項目。

學院也與其他宣教機構合作,參與中東 難民營的救援事工。

學生可以參與這些項目、作為課程所需 之宣教實習學分。參加短宣的學生也可以 向學院申請助學金。

### 課程特徵

本院持守福音信仰,課程設計以品格塑 造、靈命培育為訓練的基礎。學生在課程 修讀期間,必須參加週會、早禱會和學院 其他活動,塑造生命並學習過群體生活: 也會被安排參與師生小組,與老師和同學 定期的聚會,以小組形式進行門徒訓練。

此外,學生需要修讀宣教輔導課與牧養 輔導課,由資深宣教士與牧者作座談。課 程設計強調應用,故有牧養及宣教的實習 課,也會安排學生與老師一同宣教。

學生除了深入研究聖經外,也需接受訓 練,帶領查經及作釋經講道。

### 課堂形式

上課時間通常為週間早上及晚上,也有 密集課,歡迎在職人仕選讀。

科目編排每二年一個循環。每年四個學 期,學生可於任何一個學期開始修讀。

學院課程採用 semester hour 學分制, 每學分約為四十至四十五小時的課堂及作 業時間,包括閱讀和實習等。原則上, 學分科目上課至少24小時,三學分科目上 課至少36小時。學生每上一小時的課程, 需要在課外再用二至三小時閱讀、研習、 和完成作業等。



### 神學碩士

神學碩士乃一神學研究院之課程,是為 願意在聖經或神學方面作進深研究者而設 的學位。課程的主要目的,是幫助學員透 過研究學習,加強其宣講、教導、寫作、 或其他事奉工作之果效。課程可選擇主修 「神學研究」或「聖經研究」。

神學碩士課程的設計,可讓學生在二至 四年內完成。非全時間修讀者則須用更長 的時間,完成課程。

學生需要修讀24個學分,加上2個學分的 牧會實習(共26個學分),並達到學院的 要求,方可畢業。

若學生按需要完成61-120個學分,成績及格,並滿足其他要求,可獲得學士學位,進入神學院進修,或轉去其他學院繼續修讀。若學生已經有大專程度並擁有成績單,可以在此課程補30-60個學分,達到本科的要求。修讀完成且成績及格,會獲得「同等學士課程」證書,進入神學院修讀。

本科畢業的學生若在神學院新生聖經考試中,成績低過指定要求,需要修讀相應數量的本科程度聖經課,以提高聖經的基礎。

宗教教育學士課程共設有120個學分。高中畢業生需要修讀普及科目。

### BO211 摩西五經 (三學分)

研讀舊約聖經中的「律法書」,即創、 出、利、民、申的內容和神學。探討五經的 文學體裁,和評論當代批判學者的理論。

### BO212 歷史書 (三學分)

研讀希伯來文聖經中的「前先知書」‧即 約書亞記、士師記、撒母耳記和列王紀的內 容和神學。探討內容包括歷史書與申命記的 文學關係‧和評論當代批判學者的理論。

### BO213 聖經中的以色列 (二學分)

旅遊考察課程:透過走訪以色列各地·實 地體驗和探討·行前在課堂上從歷史、地 理、考古、文化的角度·探討聖經記載的時 代和地方·以幫助學員瞭解新舊約聖經的背 景·及解釋聖經。

### BO214 撒母耳記 (二學分)

從文學和神學角度·研讀舊約聖經中的撒母耳記·探討領袖的興衰·把書的信息應用 到現代人的生活。

### BO215 列王記 (二學分)

從文學和神學角度,研讀舊約聖經中的列 王記,探討自大衛王朝後,以色列民族領袖 的興衰,把書的信息應用到現代人的生活。

### BO216 哈該、 撒迦利亞、瑪拉基書(二學分)

從文學、歷史和神學角度精研哈該、撒迦 利亞、瑪拉基三本回歸時期的小先知書。藉 著先知們所說的話、及所看見的異象,將來 神榮耀國度的預言,應用到今天的教會和現 代人的生活。

### BO301 舊約神學 (二學分)

研讀舊約聖經的神學信息、歷史背景和發展,並探討貫穿舊約聖經的主題,如約、申典神學、智慧、天啟等,並探索舊新約聖經的一致性與多元性。

### BO311 大先知書 (三學分)

研讀舊約聖經中大先知書的內容和神學。 以賽亞書、耶利米書、耶利米哀歌、以西結 書、但以理書等,探討它們的文學技巧和歷 史背景,並把經文應用在教會事奉和信仰生 活中。

### BO312 以賽亞書 (二學分)

從文學、歷史和神學角度精研以賽亞書。 內容包括全書的一致性、作者的問題和死海 古卷發現對全書解釋的影響。

### BO313 耶利米書 (二學分)

從文學、歷史和神學角度精研耶利米書。 內容包括全書的編輯過程、它的申命記和非 申命記的特性,和死海古卷發現對全書解釋 的影響。

### BO314 詩篇 (二學分)

從文學和神學的角度,研讀舊約中的詩歌 書,探討五卷詩篇的編匯,生活中的讚美和 哀告, 祈求和感恩, 把書的信息應用到現代 人的生活。

### (二學分) BO315 約伯記

從文學和神學角度,研讀舊約聖經中的約 伯記,探討苦難與人的掙扎,把書的信息應 用到現代人的生活。

### (二學分) BO316 箴言

從文學和神學角度,研讀舊約聖經中的箴 言,探討生活的智慧,把書的信息應用到現 代人的生活。

### BO317 傳道書、雅歌 (二學分)

從文學和神學角度,研讀舊約聖經中的傳 道書和雅歌,探討人生的空虛與愛情,把兩 書的信息應用到現代人的生活。

### BO320 舊約導論 (一學分)

介紹舊約聖經寫作時的歷史、社會與文化 背景,探索舊約正典形成的過程和其神學意 義, 並探討舊約經文的鑒別, 從死海古卷、 不同的抄本和譯本中厘定馬索拉文本,以更 好的解釋聖經。

### BN111 福音書 (三學分)

從歷史、文學、和神學的角度研讀四本福 音書。選擇性的討論課題包括:符類福音的 問題和各卷福音書獨特內容和神學思想、歷 史和信心的關係、耶穌的神蹟、比喻、和天 國的教導等。

### BN112 新約書信 (三學分)

介紹新約書信及從歷史、文學和神學的角 度研讀。詳細探討某些保羅書信的經文內 容,強調如何應用書信的信息於信徒生活與 今日教會的牧養。

### BN113 使徒行傳 (二學分)

研讀使徒行傳,注重經文的背景、目的、 神學主題,並其信息對普世宣教的應用。

### BN211 約翰著作 (二學分)

從約翰著述特別的角度,研讀上帝兒子之 身位、言論與工作。内容包括約翰福音、約 翰壹、貳、參書。

### BN213 希伯來書 (二學分)

探討希伯來書的寫作背景、目的與主題; 內容特色及其所帶給我們的主要信息;從中 獲取豐富的屬靈意義,以指導我們今天的信 仰與生活。

### BN311 羅馬書 (二學分)

研讀保羅寫給羅馬教會的書信,注重該書 的背景、目的、結構、論證的進展,並其信 息對正常基督徒生活與教會牧養的應用。

### BN317 啟示錄 (二學分)

從啟示錄的內容以及相關的文學、歷史、 與神學背景,探討其歷久彌新的信息。

### BN302 新約神學 (二學分)

從救恩歷史角度研讀新約聖經的神學信 息、歷史背景和發展,並探索新約神學的一 致性和多元性。

### BN320 新約導論 (一學分)

介紹新約聖經寫作時的社會與文化背景 探索新約正典形成的過程和其神學意義,並 由此探討新約經文的鑒別,從不同的抄本、 譯本中厘定最可信的經文原本,以更好的解 釋聖經。

### 神學及歷史科目

### TT103 神、啓示與大使命(二學分)

教義與實踐 I:探討創造與創造主、三一神觀、聖經與啓示、創造論與生態危機、啟示與祭司國度的誕生和發展等並候新天新地的來到等。探討實踐基督徒召命中的祈禱與在多元世界中宣揚三一真神的美善。

### TT104 基督、人與救恩(二學分)

教義與實踐 II:從聖經研究、教會歷史和信仰實踐三個角度去探討人的受造、墮落與神人之間的聖約;並透過基督的生平、道成肉身和祂的工作。把握基督的職分、贖罪功能和復活升天的救恩意義。及其對當代信徒的生活實踐和靈性增長。

### TT204 聖靈的位格與工作(二學分)

教義與實踐Ⅲ:聖靈的工作是為了彰顯神在教會和世上的榮耀和大能。透過三一教義檢視聖靈的神性與位格,從新舊兩約及教會歷史認識聖靈的作為,討論聖靈的洗與被聖靈充滿的經驗,從聖靈論檢視當代的靈恩運動,追尋屬靈美德,分辨屬靈的恩賜。透過學習聖靈論,進深個人及群體祈禱生活,提昇靈命;對聖徒的恆忍和治理教會,發展出教會增長和屬靈力量。

### TT205 當代教會論(二學分)

教義與實踐 IV:教會有地方教會及普世教會。自信徒重生的一刻,聖靈就使信徒與基督聯合,借助水禮和聖餐表明出來。聖經用不同的比喻來形容教會和其特徵。地方教會以聖禮、聖道、聖工和聖徒的團契承接會國基業;也有監督、長老和執事等治理教會論或是對學的視度,明白普世教會的義會。 整全的教會觀實踐基督爲首教會為體。

### TT203 護教學 (二學分)

探討聖經中的護教方法、歷代主要護教的 進路,及處理一些主要基督教護教課題如異 端、神的存在、苦難與罪、近代及當代護教 思潮等。

### TT301 基督教倫理學 (二學分)

探討聖經和神學的倫理基礎,探討當代倫 理課題:離婚與再婚、同性戀、墮胎、安樂 死、人工受孕、謊言、死刑、政治倫理等。

### TH101 世界教會歷史 I (二學分)

探討從初期教父至宗教改革前的西方教會歷史。因為逼害、異端的興起,教會相應發展出教義、體制組織和君士坦丁開設的教會會議。之後修道主義產生,神聖羅馬帝國興起:中世紀時大公教會分裂、十字軍東征、經院哲學和人文主義的興起,最後引出宗教改革。(網絡課程)

### TH102 世界教會歷史 II (二學分)

研究宗教改革後的西方教會歷史。中世紀的文藝復興引發宗教改革,反宗教改革運動相應發生。之後啟蒙運動、敬虔主義、理性主義、大覺醒運動、宣教運動相繼興起。普世宣教及後來的各種主義、包括資本主義等,逐漸把西方教會的重要性淡化,帶來廿一世紀的新局面。(網絡課程)

### TH201 中國教會歷史 I (二學分)

探討基督教在中國的起源及發展·包括唐朝的景教、元朝的也里可溫、明末清初天主教、馬禮遜來華·基督教(新教)至共產中國的發展狀況。(網絡課程)

### TH202 中國教會歷史Ⅱ(二學分)

繼續探討基督教從共產中國至今的發展狀況,以及神在中國教會所行的奇妙作為,及 教會今天所面臨的挑戰。(網絡課程)

### TR301 基督教與中國文化 (二學分)

探討中國社會文化的「傳統」和「變革」 ·基督教與兩者的關係。內容包括中國文 化的特性、異文化的吸收及其對中國人的思 想、社會的影響、現代中國知識分子對變革 的反省 · 和基督教對中國可能有的貢獻。

### TR303 以巴衝突與中東歷史 ( 二學分 )

探討自1948年以來以色列與巴勒斯坦的 戰爭與和談,近代中東歷史,當今的政治地 圖、尤其以色列的政治、宗教與文化;聖經 與土地的神學,舊約律法、天國和人權;並 探討廿一世紀的基督徒該如何回應。

### TR304 三大一神宗教 (二學分)

探討猶太教、基督教、伊斯蘭教的興起、 關係與衝突;三大一神宗教的正典、信仰和 文化;它們其中的派系與彼此的關係;廿一 世紀社會的改變帶給它們的衝擊;基督徒應 該如何面對這三大宗教與它們的派系。

### 事工裝備科目

### MB101 研經法與教學法 I (二學分)

學習研讀聖經、應用和教導的方法、能有 效地帶領小組查經和教導主日學,使學員生 命有所改變。使用舊約聖經的歷史書作為課 堂實習。

### MB102 研經法與教學法 II (二學分)

進深學習研讀聖經、應用和教導的方法、 能有效地帶領小組查經和教導主日學,使學 員生命有所改變。使用舊約聖經的先知書作 為課堂實習。

### MB201 釋經講道 (三學分)

藉講解、課堂實習及評估,幫助學生掌握 釋經講道的基本原則及實踐原理,裝備他們 如何從研經開始,按全書的主題和上下文, 逐章撰寫講章,並作有效的宣講。內容包括 專題式講章、舊約歷史書和新約福音書的釋 經講道。

### MB202 講道實習 (二學分)

進深讓學生在課堂或週會中操練講道並接 受評估。內容包括舊約詩歌智慧書和新約書 信的釋經講道。

### MM101 佈道法 (二學分)

教導學員傳福音,領人歸主,並提供佈 道實踐機會。內容包括佈道預工、佈道的聖 經基礎,個人佈道材料,佈道方法與技巧。

### MM302 北美華人教會植堂 (二學分)

探討植堂之聖經基礎及模式、北美城市中 華人福音的需要、植堂與教會增長及教會健 康的關係、在教會中推動植堂的步驟並進行 植堂時所需考慮的各種策略。

### MP204 教牧學 (三學分)

探討牧者與長執的職責和職事。從聖經、 神學及實踐三方面研討牧師、長老、傳道與 執事同工的呼召、角色及實行教會事工,包 括領會、聖禮、探訪、婚喪、靈命輔導及教 會行政等。

### MP206 精神健康與教牧輔導(二學分)

認識華人精神問題如抑鬱、自殺的情況, 並其中文化因素和治療的阻礙。辨識精神問 題與基因、大腦功能和環境的關係,探討教 牧輔導的方向,並建立信徒的精神健康。

### MP207 僕人領導 (二學分)

僕人領導的七個核心:愛、谦卑、 服務、 合作、勇氣、誠信、卓越,是僕人領導的精 髓。探討聖經中的僕人領導,如何算是一個 真正的僕人,及僕人領導的創新及實踐等。

### MP210 團體領導與衝突解決(二學分)

探討有效的教會領導方式;以聖經原則和 現代管理方式去處理教牧同工、教牧與信徒 之間的衝突;將衝突分頖,以愛心、理性及 系統方式,處理不同的衝突等。

### MP211 藝術與信仰 (二學分)

透過藝術歷史的發展及藝術作品的鑑賞 包括不同畫派的演變及影響,探討基督教藝 術與信仰的關係,靜觀藝術作品所扮演的角 色,用以舉辦與福音有關的事工。

### MP212 基督教輔導 (二學分)

本課程從聖經原則、教會牧靈傳統、基督 教輔導和近代心理學四方面,引導學生瞭解 牧養靈性、掌握聖經輔導和短期則略,助長 教會關懷事工。

### IB/IT/IM 個別指導 (一至三學分)

學生可透過老師的准許與個別指導,作某 課題的研究,完成學院的學分要求 。

### 福音傳播科目

必需自備手提電腦、科目所需的所有軟件、 數碼攝影機、並剪接影片的軟件。

### GC102 雲端與電腦簡報 (一學分)

本課程理論及技巧兼顧‧教授如何正確使用相片、插畫及構圖來製作成功的電腦簡報。學習如何有效將簡報使用在教會的團契、小組聚會及個人講道上。

此科為先修科,只計算學士課程學分。

### GC201 網頁設計I (二學分)

Adobe Dreamweaver CS4網頁設計技巧,包括網頁設計的基本原則、Cascading Style Sheets (CSS)、JavaScript、HTML的應用、影片檔、音檔、行為使用、資料庫表格製作並整合Google App來接收使用者送出的資料,及完整的網路系統認識與架設。<選課要求>: 有使用網路的經驗

### GC211 網頁設計II (二學分)

本課程延續《網頁設計I》·提供有意製作專業水準網站者更多網頁設計技巧來製作Dynamic Website。

### GC302 電腦圖像處理與設計 (二學分)

學習使用Photoshop基本功能工具來修改圖片和製作合成圖片。透過本課程實際做出教會界常需要的海報文宣,並將涉及基本色彩學,平面設計和網路傳播等知識。

### GC304 社會媒體與網路事奉(二學分)

本課程探討移動世界的趨勢,並服事理念的更新,進而探索應用上下左右聯合、中西聯合等在網絡宣教上。工具學習包括YouVersion,QQ,Twitter,Google+,Facebook,微博/新浪等電腦軟件。<選課要求>:有使用網路的經驗

### GC305網路宣教(二學分)

結合神學理論和教會生活、剖析網絡宣教應該使用的內容(Content)·使用新媒體傳播(Process)·讓網絡宣教效果(Outcome)達到最大化。課程也探討神的呼召並學員如何使用新媒體的方法·以靈活地走進網絡禾場。研讀「網絡宣教」課程、並使用「微信」找到網絡宣教的竅門和方法·參與網絡宣教。

### 創意傳媒進階課程

訓練學生成為能夠熟練運用多媒體和流媒體技術、獨立製作文檔、音檔與視頻和紀錄片、成為教會、社區或機構急需的復合型傳媒人才。合格學生可以在優視頻道實習。設備要求:蘋果筆記本 MacBook pro/Mac Air,錄音功能手機。需要戶外採訪、拍攝。

### GC311 平面媒體採訪(二學分)

第一階段初級:幫助學生了解傳媒業歷史 與發展趨勢·學習、掌握選題策劃、基本採 訪、整理採訪資料的方法·學習編輯技巧。 學生獨立寫作一篇1000字以上稿件·並製作 成一個雜誌頁面的內容。

### GC312 平面設計(二學分)

第一階段高級:掌握平面設計的基本原理和美學。以小組的形式完成對一個事件或一個人物的採訪報道,製作成一期專題報道,達到新聞報道發表的程度。要求版面設計美觀大方、字體運用得當、內容清晰好看。

### GC313 廣播節目採訪(二學分)

第二階段初級:幫助學生了解廣播媒體傳播的特點與趨勢,提升採訪技巧,掌握錄音方法,學習聲音文件的剪輯方法,和製作廣播節目的基本技巧。學生獨立完成一個廣播節目製作(5分鐘以上)。要求語言清晰、音樂流暢、主題鮮明。

### GC314 播客的制作(二學分)

第二階段高級:提升學生採訪技巧,掌握錄音方法,學習聲音文件的剪輯方法,幫助學生做一檔具有既有專業水準,又好聽的福音廣播節目(Podcast)。需要實地採訪,並製作一期廣播節目(長度約10分鐘)。

### GC315 視頻節目製作(二學分)

第三階段初級:幫助學生了解電視媒體的 特點,了解電視臺運作的基本流程,掌握攝 影、攝像的基本操作技巧。學生獨立製作一 個視頻(約3分鐘)。需要戶外採訪、拍攝。

### GC316 紀錄片製作(二學分)

第三階段高級:幫助學生尋找合適的選題開展研究·寫作拍攝大綱·完成採訪、拍攝、剪輯。全班共同完成一部紀錄片(10分鐘以上)·達到電視臺的播放水準。需要戶外採訪、拍攝。

### CM101 音樂基本理論 I (二學分)

探討基礎和實用的音樂理論知識,加強教會詩班、讚美敬拜團隊及信徒識譜、讀譜和視唱能力,提升他們參與教會事奉的音樂基礎。課程內容包括從「音」到「音程」。

此科為先修科,只算作學士課程學分。

### CM102 音樂基本理論 Ⅱ (二學分)

繼續CM101·增強識譜、讀譜和視唱能力,提升他們參與教會事奉的音樂基礎、課程內容包括從「音程」到「和聲、和弦」。

此科為先修科,只算作學士課程學分。

### CM103 電鋼琴伴奏 I (二學分)

彈奏的基礎練習。學習正三和弦;通過基礎課程、進行讀譜、對位和手指靈活彈奏的訓練。並彈奏《哈農練指法》上的音階和琶音部分練習。

<選課要求>: 通過甄選,才計算學分

### CM104 電鋼琴伴奏 II (二學分)

為歌曲旋律配伴奏—包括正三和弦的應用練習,練習歌曲括聖詩和世界名曲。分析讚美詩歌的和弦,學習彈奏四聲部讚美詩歌。

### CM105 電鋼琴伴奏 III (二學分)

為簡譜和五線譜詩歌配伴奏·用副三和弦替代正三和弦的應用練習;並移調彈奏練習和不帶旋律的伴奏方式·要求彈奏准確、富有表情。

### CM106 實用崇拜學 (二學分)

從聖經看聖樂事工,敬拜與聲樂的關係; 學習如何帶領敬拜:結合敬拜的特點與教會 的實際應用,進行神學和牧養的思考,探討 崇拜的原則,並建構崇拜禮儀。

### CM107 視唱練耳 I (二學分)

聽音模唱‧即音高音準的練習‧包括單音和大、小三和弦判斷;節奏訓練‧正確的發聲方法‧並視唱讀譜‧訓練調性、節拍。練習歌曲包括視唱曲、讚美詩和藝術歌曲。

### CM108 視唱練耳 II (二學分)

繼續CM107·聽旋律記譜--4至8小節的記譜訓練;節拍與節奏-不同節奏型聽記訓練;發聲訓練--歌唱前的開聲練習;練習歌曲包括視唱曲、經文短歌、讚美詩、意大利歌曲和蘇俄歌曲。

### CM111 詩班指揮 (二學分)

在樂理和視唱練耳的基礎上, 進深節奏和節拍的訓練; 指揮必須具備的條件和狀態; 學習拍子的種類及圖式, 有效的揮拍動作和雙手協調分工; 合唱指揮的發聲要求; 使學員從「擊拍者」到「帶領者」到「訓練者」

### BO501 七十士譯本 (三學分)

探討舊約聖經七十士譯本的起源、基督教 和猶太教群體對這希臘文譯本的接受程度, 並它對經文鑑定和經文解釋的影響。課程會 探討不同書卷經文的翻譯特點。

### BO502 耶利米書 (三學分)

深入研讀耶利米書的宏觀架構和整本書的 主題、出埃及主題、先知的投訴和眼淚、瑪 索拉文本與七十士譯本的差異,並死海古卷 的發現對成書理論的意義。

### BO503 申典歷史 (三學分)

探討「申典歷史」 - 即申命記加「前先知書」 - 書、士、撒、王等四本舊約書卷是否一個整體的以色列歷史·並作者是否要向被擄的人指出猶大的亡國是不可復原的。從經文探討M. Noth 的理論·並提出修正·以進一步掌握申命記和前先知書的特性和應用。

### BO504 經文鑑定 (三學分)

學習希伯來文聖經瑪索拉文本BHS、和聯合聖經公會UBS希臘文版本內的經文鑑定資料庫 critical apparatus;且應用經文鑑定的原則、從資料庫內眾多的抄本、譯本中鑑定並選用可信的經文原本,以此解釋聖經,並探討其神學意義。

### BN501 保羅神學課題 (三學分)

進深研究保羅神學的課題,如基督論、稱 義與成聖、聖靈論、教會論等。

### BN502 新約引用舊約 (三學分)

新約聖經直接引用舊約聖經340次‧間接引用有2300次。兩約的經文有確實的文學與神學的關係。課程探討新約作者引用舊約經文時所表達的解釋方法、兩約經文的修辭關聯性,並它們對聖經整體解釋的影響。

### TT501 當代神學與教義 (三學分)

課程探索建構基督教教義和當代神學的元素,並探討當代神學與系統神學的關係、不同的議題、詮釋聖經的方法;它對神的本性及三一神教義提出的進路,及它對牧養教會的意義。

### TT502 神學語言與創造 (三學分)

探索創世記第一、二章使用的神學語言去所描述神如何「從無有中、從混沌中」七日的創造。特別注意研究創造故事、進化論的科學及生態危機的關係,信徒如何能夠辯護良善的創造主為何容許自然災難發生。

### DS601 神學碩士論文 (六學分)

寫作神學碩士程度的學術論文。選擇一個有價值的題目,經指導教授的幫助,作進深的學術研究,寫作論文。 論文字數必須在三萬至四萬五千字之間,包括書目。論文完成後、指導教授也滿意,需要在論文委員會前答辯。委員會成員包括指導教授和多兩位評閱員,其中起碼一位是外來評閱員。

學分學科如師生小組、輔導和實習等皆以 P (及格)或F(不及格)厘定成績。此等科目 的成績,將不會計算平均成績。

學生若因特別情況,如個人患病、或家庭危 機等,未能在學季完結前或教師所定時間內完 成指定功課,可以書面要求該科作未能完成論 (I),但必須與教師商議、另定繳交作業日 期,最長限期為三個月。

學生可以在指定期限前退選(W)。若過了 退選期限,該科成績將會是F(不及格)。

所有科目的退選(W)或旁聽,或學士課程 科目,都不計算學分。

學生只能在每科目的首兩週申請退選(W) ;轉為非學分的旁聽則須在結課之前,且繳交 行政費用。

在所有情況下,學生若不能在學季完結後的 三個月內,完成指定作業,成績將會是F,也 不能申請轉為非學分。

若某科目取得成績在 C、D 或 F 級,學生可 選擇重修,重修後的成績級別會用作評定總成 績分 (GPA) 之用。但兩個成績級別都會保留在 學院記錄內。 學生也可申請把該科目轉為不計 算學分,但成績會保留。

學生必須在每學期取得總平均分2.00或以 上,及在畢業時累積總平均分2.70或以上,方 可申請畢業。學生若對某科目所得的成績不滿 意,可於一學期內用書面向院方提出上訴。

### 試讀和停學

若學生的成績未能達到學院要求的水平,學 院將以書面通知學生由正修生改為試讀生。若 連續試讀三個學期,成績仍未能改善,學院會 取消該學生就讀的資格。若修讀學位的學生在 一學期內的總平均分低於1.30,將會在學期末 被要求退學,改作旁聽生。

學生的品格、德行及言行舉止應符合聖經準 則。若有違背聖經的教導,並經教師屢勸不聽 者,學院會建議其退學。若該學生對其他同學 造成困擾,學院會立刻停止其繼續學習,並勒 令退學。

### 學分之轉移與認可

學生在註冊入讀「美福神學院」前完成相關 的學科,可用書面向教務處申請轉學分。曾修 讀的學科內容必須與本院的學科內容接近,而 總成績單正本的各科成績等級必須在2.70或以 上,並且該科目的成績是在申請入學前的七年 內獲得才會被接納;超過七年的必需重修。除 特殊情況外,所有轉往本院的學分,不能超過 申請本院修讀學位所要求的一半。

### 缺課規則

學生必須出席修讀科目的全部課堂,不得無 故曠課。本院教師沒有義務幫助學生補課。若 因故未能出席課堂,應事前通知該科教師。原 則上,學生每學期各科的缺課時間不能超過課 程要求的30%,否則作「不及格」論,或由教 師決定給與其他的成績級別。若缺課超過課程 要求的50%,就是「不及格」。

### 畢業要求

學生必須達到以下的要求,才可以畢業:

- 持守福音信仰,在品格和行為上合乎聖 經的準則
- 在指定時間內完成所有指定的課程要求
- 學業成績達到課程要求的水平
- 聖經考試成績達到70%以上
- 繳付全部費用包括畢業費
- 在註冊組填妥有關的畢業文件
- 獲得教授團的推薦,並董事會的批准
- 出席應屆畢業典禮。若未能出席‧必須 用書面向教務主任提出並獲准許
- 以轉換課程申請提前畢業者,必須完成 新課程所有的要求,並填寫轉換專業課 程申請表、交費,方可領取畢業證書。

### 總成績單

「美福神學院」學生和校友可向校方索取總成績單。畢業時所寄發的首份總成績單免費,之後每份正式成績單收費\$30加所需郵費。申請成績單須以書面提交教務處。總成績單會直接寄往所申請入讀的學校或有關人什。

### 學術處分

「美福神學院」假定所有學生入學申請文件及畢業證明文件皆屬確實和完整,也假定所有學科指定的功課和考試均是學生個人所做。學術上的欺詐、作弊和私自盜用他人作品作為自己作品的皆屬違規。學生在寫作專文時,無論直接或間接引用他人的意見或著作,必須清楚列明來源出處。若發現抄襲或作弊個案,將交由教員會處以勸戒、警告或給與該科成績「不合格」等。

若學生覺得受到控訴或處分不公平,可以 向教務主任提出上訴。學院保留權利,要求 在學術上欺詐的學生退學。

### 入學申請

### 申請需知

「美福神學院」要求每位入讀的學生,有 重生的生命特質,過榮耀神的生活,有謙卑 受教的心,接受聖經為信仰和生活的權威, 並願意委身服事主耶穌基督。入讀的學生也 須有事奉的心志、足夠的學習能力、能以完 成研究院程度的課程。

學院有權拒絕非基督徒或神學立場有違背本學院基本信仰者的申請。在收生方面,學院也有權考慮申請人的品格和成績。申請人必須從被認可的四年制大專、或大學取得學士學位或同等學歷。若未有四年制學士學位者,可在認可的大學或在「美福神學院」補滿所要求的學分。

學院以中文授課為主,因此申請者必須具備中文聽、寫及閱讀能力,也應該能夠閱讀 英文參考書。

### 截止報名日期

一切申請文件必須儘早辦妥交回學院註冊 組。學院在收妥有關入學申請的文件後,會 由註冊委員會審核,通過之後會以書面通知 申請人有關情況。假如院方需要更多資料, 會與申請人聯絡。申請人亦可致雷學院註冊 組查詢。

### 學士課程

凡沒有本科畢業的學生需要修讀「宗教教 育學士課程」以提高學術基礎,並補學分。 成績總平均分2.70 或以上才可以畢業,進入 神學院修讀。

神學院學生在新生輔導時,需要參加聖經 考試。若成績低過指定要求,需要在修讀學 位的同時、修讀「宗教教育學士課程」的聖 經課。特別情況下,經教務處批准、可以選 擇多修神學院的聖經課。學生在畢業前,必 需通過聖經考試。

對神學院學生而言,學士課程的目的是幫 助學生適應美福神學院研究院程度的學習。 這些非學分的課程包括學士課程的聖經課、 英語和神學寫作等。

學生在入學時,需要參加「英語」考試。 若成績低於指定要求,在修讀學位的同時, 可以修讀「英語」課程。目的是為幫助學生 能閱讀英文聖經和指定參考書籍。

神學寫作是為沒有神學院背景的學生而設 的,課程的目的是提高學生寫作神學院專文 的水準。內容包括專文格式、寫作技巧和研 究方法。

### 註冊

### 註冊手續

學生應熟讀本目錄,清楚知道修讀學位所 要求的核心科目和選修科目。學生沒有註冊 的科目,不得聽課。

學生欲註冊修讀任何課程,包括八週或十 二週的科目、師生小組、輔導課程,並密集 課程等,必須於學期註冊期限前到美福網站 上、註冊該學期學生要修讀的所有科目。逾 期註冊者,均需聯絡註冊組、並每科繳交「 遲註冊」費。

實習課程、個別指導和保留學位等,必須 向註冊組註冊。

## ntroduction

### Vision and Mission

Since the last decades of the Twentieth Century, God has been graciously blessing the gospel and mission work in China and among the Chinese communities worldwide. In North America and Asia, there are many Christians who are willing to commit themselves to serve God in the gospel ministry. They need to be well equipped in the Bible, in spirituality, in ministerial skills and in mission work through an advanced and practical seminary education. In the summer of 2005, a group of Christian leaders recognized the need to train ministers for the harvest of the gospel. Under the guidance of God, this group established the America Chinese Evangelical Seminary (ACES) to prepare men and women to dedicate themselves for God's kingdom and to obey the Great Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ.

America Chinese Evangelical Seminary is a non-profit Christian organization incorporated under the laws of the State of California. The goals of ACES are as follows:

- To build up spiritually mature Christians as the Lord's servants
- To equip Christians for ministry in mission fields in China and overseas
- To equip good shepherds and Bible teachers for local church ministries
- To do research and publish books, produce videos and CDs related to Christian Education, Bible study, Theology, Spirituality, Mission etc.

The five core values of ACE Seminary are: freedom, responsibility, respect, authenticity, service. These core values serve as the guidelines for the actions and fellowship of the Seminary.

The Seminary is authorized under U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to issue I-20 to enroll nonimmigrant alien students.

### Statement of Faith

The basic Christian beliefs that ACES holds and propagates are as follows:

- 1. We believe there is one true God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- 2. We believe in God the Father, the allpowerful, all knowing, all loving, and all righteous God, who is the Creator and Sustainer of all things.
- 3. We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, His sinless life, His miracles, His atoning death through His shed blood, His bodily resurrection, His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and His imminent personal return.
- 4. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Godhead, co-existent with the Father and the Son. His present ministry is to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ, and to indwell, guide, teach, empower the believer and convict the world of sin, righteousness and judgment. We adopt a conservative stance with regard to excessive charismatic expressions.
- 5. We believe in the Holy Scriptures, inerrant as originally given, inspired by God and a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men. They constitute the divine and highest rule of Christian faith and practice.
- 6. Man was created in the image and likeness of God, but fell into sin. The entire human race is, therefore, lost, and only through repentance and faith in Jesus Christ and regeneration of the Holy Spirit can salvation and eternal life be obtained.
- 7. The Church is one body, consisting of those regenerated by the Holy Spirit, of which Christ is the Head. Christ has commissioned the Church to go into the world as a witness, preaching the gospel and making disciples of all nations and to teach the disciples to obey all our Lord's commands.
- 8. There shall be a bodily resurrection of the just and of the unjust; for the just, a resurrection unto eternal life; for the unjust, a resurrection unto judgment.

### **Location and Facilities**

America Chinese Evangelical Seminary is located south of San Francisco in Sunnyvale, California. Sunnyvale is situated in the center of the Silicon Valley. There are many high-tech companies and shopping malls in the city, and traffic is convenient. Routes 101 and 237 provide easy access to other areas of the Bay Area. It takes 30 minutes to get to the San Francisco International Airport, and 15 minutes to the San Jose International Airport.

The Seminary is on Stewart Drive. Its floor area is 7,300 square feet, which includes offices, chapel hall, library, classrooms, electronic keyboard classroom and kitchen. There are more than 100 parking spaces outside the building complex. The library holds a collection of about 10,000 volumes, with more to be added.

Due to the convenient location, students and faculty can apply, at no cost, for user cards at the City Library of Santa Clara, and enjoy borrowing privileges of the Santa Clara University library nearby. Students can also access the library of the Stanford University and St. Patrick Seminary with a user fee.

ACES has two dormitories for students, both single and with family.

### Collaboration

Since 2018 summer, the Seminary has collaborated with the Luke Christian Medial Mission to set up a medical and community involvement project in the slum area of Dhaka, the capital of Bangladesh.

The Seminary also collaborates with other mission agencies to participate in projects for refugee camps in the Middle East.

Students can participate in the projects for service or to fulfill the requirements of mission internship of their study programs. Students who go may apply for financial aid from the Seminary.

### **Programs of Study**

ACES offers the following programs:

- 1. Master of Theology (24 credits)
- 2. Master of Divinity (96 credits)--Areas of Concentrations: Mission, Pastoral, Bible
- 3. Master of Biblical Studies (64 credits) Master of Pastoral Studies (64 credits) Tracks: Urban Mission, Gospel Comms., Music Ministries
- 4. Diploma of Biblical Studies (32 credits) Diploma of Gospel Communications (32 credits)
- 5. Bachelor of Religious Education (120 credits)
- 6. Extension Certificate (24 credits) Advanced Extension Certificate (36 credits)

### **Features**

Based upon the Statement of Faith, the curriculum is designed to facilitate character formation and spiritual growth. Throughout the entire program of their study, all students will have to attend all assembly and prayer meetings and school activities. Each student will be assigned to a small group. The small group consists of a faculty member and students, who will meet regularly for discipleship and community life.

All students will enroll mission mentorship and pastoral mentorship courses for credits. Seasoned missionaries and pastors will share and give counsel during the sessions. The curriculum is designed to emphasize application, so there are ample requirements for internship. Faculty and students will go on mission trips together. Besides studying the Bible in depth, all students will learn to lead Bible study and deliver expository preaching.

### Class Format

Classes are normally held during weekday mornings and evenings. Moreover, there will be intensive courses.

Courses will be offered in two-year cycles. There are four terms in one year, and students can begin their program of study in any of the four terms.

ACE Seminary records each credit learning by the semester hour, which represents 40-45 hours of classroom instruction, assigned readings, academic research and field practice. Normally, a 2-credit course consists of twenty-four hours of classroom instruction including breaks, and a 3-credit course consists of thirty-six hours of classroom instruction including breaks. For each hour in class, students should anticipate studying approximately two to three hours outside of class, including academic research for the assignments.

# <sup>2</sup>rogram Outlines

### Master of Theology

The Master of Theology is a guided study program designed to provide advanced research in either the field of biblical study or theological study for graduate students. The program is to prepare the student to advance in teaching, preaching, writing and other ministries.

The program is designed to be completed within two to four years. Those who study on a part-time basis may extend their study over a longer period of time.

The student is required to successfully complete 24 credits and additional 2 credits pastoral internship (total 26 credits ) for this program as follows:

### Admission

Applicants should have the following:

- a Master of Divinity degree and a bachelor degree
- the cumulative grade point average of M.Div. is 3.30 and above
- language requirements: can read the Bible in its original language of Hebrew and Greek, and other English theological works
- accepted by the Faculty

### Master of Divinity

The Master of Divinity program prepares the student for full-time service in the kingdom of God. It allows the student to train either for the general pastorate of some local churches or for a specialized ministry as a staff minister. It also enables the student to meet the general requirements for denominational ordination. Students may choose a concentration in such areas as missions, pastoral ministry, or biblical studies.

The program is designed to be completed within three to four years. Those who study on a part-time basis may extend their study over a longer period of time. The curriculum is built upon a system of four core areas. These areas are Life Formation, Biblical Studies, Theology and History, and Ministry. In addition, three areas of concentration are offered, enabling students to focus their studies according to their individual interests.

The student is required to successfully complete 96 credits for this program as follows:

### Six Quarters ( HUMI )

Students can equip themselves with biblical truth or ministerial skills, and for spiritual growth.

The certificate program is a non-degree program. A student will be awarded a Certificate upon completing 36 credits.

### Bachelor of Religious Education

The bachelor program is offered for individuals who do not have a bachelor degree. The program is designed to help them transit to the graduate level study at the ACE Seminary.

The student who complete 60 credits and above will be awarded the bachelor degree and continue graduate studies in ACES or transfer to other education institutes.

The student who complete 2 or 3 years undergraduate studies can make up to 4 years bachelor degree under this program. The students who complete less than 60 credits will be awarded the Equivalent Bachelor Program Diploma, and continue graduate studies in ACES.

Seminary students who score below a designated level in the Bible placement test need to enroll in Bible courses of the bachelor program as prerequisites. They have to pass all the Bible courses before enrolling the seminary Bible classes.

The bachelor program consists of 120 credits in total. High School graduates may take General Studies.

# **Course Descriptions**

### **Life Formation Courses**

### FS101 Spiritual Formation I (2 credits)

A study of the spiritual dynamics involved in the transformation of a person. The course provides biblical, theological, and psychological perspectives and selfassessment for understanding human conditions, spirituality, and how holy habits are formed. The focus is on the spiritual disciplines that nourish Christian growth.

### FS201 Spiritual Formation II (2 credits)

This course is a study on the indwelling of Christ, inner healing, and spiritual discernment through studying the Bible, the works of masters, and discussion of course readings. The focus is on personal practice and its application in small group settings.

### FS205 Family of Origin (2 credits)

A study of family systems and how family of origin forms our self-value, interpersonal relationship, and negative influences. Topics include how to differentiate from the family of origin and build a healthy self. Include group therapy time to increase selfawareness.

### FS206 Emotional Regulation (2 credits)

A study of the nature, role, and function of emotions, how they impact actions and choices, and how to recognize and regulate emotions. Topics include theology of emotions and their impact on spirituality. Include group therapy time to increase awareness of one's own emotions.

### FG101, 201, 301, 401, 501, 601 Small Group & Discipleship (1 to 6 credits)

Small group is a knowledge-in-action program through regular meetings with faculty and students for discipleship, counseling, and community experience. The meetings are designed to be a formative process for spiritual growth and character formation.

### FM101 Mission Mentorship (1 credit)

A series of seminars by seasoned missionaries to share practical experience, discuss skills and strategies in evangelism, answer questions, and pray together. In addition, through personal consultation and small group format, students learn to carry out missions more effectively.

### FP101 Pastoral Mentorship (1 credit)

A series of seminars by seasoned pastors to share practical experience, discuss pastoral skills and church planting strategies, answer questions, and pray together. In addition, through personal consultation and small group format, students learn to carry out pastoral ministry more effectively.

### FM301, 302, 303, 304 Mission Internship (1 to 4 credits)

A planned and evaluated practical experience in a cross-cultural mission overseas or a local evangelistic setting with supervision.

### FP301, 302, 303, 304 Pastoral Internship (1 to 4 credits)

A planned and evaluated practical experience for three months in a church setting or a parachurch organization with pastoral supervision.

### FS102 Life & Community (1 to 6 credits)

A practical experience for students to learn to put community above themselves, serve and submit to each other, and submit to authority. Students will have to participate in the seminary's activities which includes assembly meetings, annual dinner, commencement, choir practice, clean up and orientations. One credit for each half year, not counted towards GPA.

## **Biblical Studies Courses**

#### BL103 Greek I (2 credits)

An introduction to the basic grammar and vocabulary of New Testament Greek, with practice in reading the book of First John. (online course)

#### BL104 Hebrew I (2 credits)

An Introduction to the basic grammar and vocabulary of Old Testament Hebrew, with practice in reading the book of Samuel. (online course)

#### BL201 Greek II (2 credits)

A continuation of BL103. A study of basic grammar, syntax and vocabulary of New Testament Greek, with practice in reading the book of First John. (online course)

#### BL202 Greek III (2 credits)

A study of the more advanced New Testament Greek grammar and syntax, with practice in reading the book of Philippians in reference to theological dictionaries and critical commentaries.

#### BL203 Hebrew II (2 credits)

A continuation of BL104, a study of the basic grammar, syntax and vocabulary of Old Testament Hebrew, with practice in reading the book of Samuel. (online course)

#### BL204 Hebrew III (2 credits)

A study of textual criticism, lexical and syntactical analysis of the Old Testament Hebrew texts, with practice in reading the book of Jeremiah in reference to versions and critical commentaries.

#### BS301 Biblical Interpretation (3 credits)

A study of the history of biblical interpretation, exegetical methods and tools, and the theories of understanding and interpreting biblical texts. Special attention will be given to the influence of presupposition, the nature of language and the approach of text-centered interpretation.

#### **BO211 Pentateuch (3 credits)**

A study of the content and theology of the first five books of the Old Testament. Special attention will be given to literary nature, structure and theological message. Origin and genetic development of the Pentateuch will also be discussed.

#### **BO212 Historical Books (3 credits)**

A study of the content and theology of the Former Prophets of the Hebrew Bible, i.e. the books of Joshua, Judges, Samuel and Kings. Special attention will be given to their literary relationship with Deuteronomy, and a critique of contemporary critical scholarship.

#### BO213 The Biblical Israel (2 credits)

A study tour of Israel with special attention to the geographical and historical setting of the Bible, and the cultural background as indicated by archaeological finds. There will be classes before and during the tour, to facilitate students to understand the Biblical Israel.

#### BO214 Samuel (2 credits)

A literary, historical and theological study of the Book of Samuel, with special attention on contemporary application and leadership succession.

#### BO215 Kings (2 credits)

A literary, historical and theological study of the Book of Kings, with special attention on contemporary application and leadership.

#### BO216 Haggai, Zechariah & Malachi (2 credits)

A literary, historical and theological study of the Books of Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi with special attention on apocalyptic literature and contemporary application.

#### BO301 OT Theology (2 credits)

A study of the theological message, historical background and its development of the Old Testament. Attention will be given to the topics like covenant, Deuteronomic theology, wisdom, and apocalypse that weave in and out of the Old Testament books as a whole.

#### **BO311 Major Prophets (3 credits)**

A study of the content, literary styles, historical background and theology of the Major Prophets, i.e. the books of Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentation, Ezekiel and Daniel. Special attention will be given as to how the messages of the five books may be applied to contemporary life.

#### BO312 Isaiah (2 credits)

A literary, historical, and theological study of the book of Isaiah. Special attention will be given to its literary unity, authorship, and the significance of the Dead Sea Discoveries on its meaning.

#### BO313 Jeremiah (2 credits)

A literary, historical and theological study of the book of Jeremiah. Special attention will be given to its redaction activities, Deuteronomic and non-Deuteronomic characteristics, and the significance of the Dead Sea Discoveries on its meaning.

#### BO314 Psalms (2 credits)

A literary, historical and theological study of the book of Psalms. Special attention will be given to the formation of the five books of Psalms, and how the praises, laments, prayers, and thanksgivings may be applied to contemporary

#### BO315 Job (2 credits)

A literary and theological study of Job of the Old Testament, with emphasis on contemporary application.

#### **BO316 Proverbs (2 credits)**

A literary and theological study of Proverbs of the Old Testament, with emphasis on contemporary application.

#### BO317 Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs (2 credits)

A literary and theological study of Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs of the Old Testament, with emphasis on contemporary application.

#### **BO320 Old Testament Introduction (1 credit)**

A study of the historical background and canon of the Old Testament, an evaluation of Old Testament criticism, and an examination of special introductory problems of Masorectic Text like Dead Sea discoveries.

#### BN111 Gospels (3 credits)

An introduction to the four Gospels as history, literature, and theology. Topics of discussion include: the synoptic problem and the distinctive features and theology of each of the four Gospels; relationship between history and faith; Jesus' miracles, parables and teaching about the Kingdom.

#### **BN112 New Testament Epistles (3 credits)**

An introduction to the Epistles and their theology. Selected Pauline epistles will be studied with emphasis on the application of Pauline theology to Christian life and the pastoral needs of the churches in our time.

#### BN113 Acts (2 credits)

An exegesis of the Book of Acts. Attention will be given to its background, purpose, structure, theological themes, and their significance for missionary application.

#### BN211 Johannine Literature (2 credits)

A study of the person, teachings and work of the Son of God according to John as depicted in his Gospel and letters.

#### BN213 Hebrews (2 credits)

A study of the background, purpose and the theme of the Book of Hebrews, as well as its contents, characteristics and messages, with the purpose to discover its value of spirituality so as to guide our faith and daily life.

#### BN311 Romans (2 credits)

An exegesis of Paul's letter to the Romans. Attention will be given to its background, purpose, structure, theological themes and their significance for Christian life and pastoral application.

#### BN317 Revelation (2 credits)

A study of the background, purpose and the theme of the Book of Revelation, as well as its apocalyptic characteristics and messages, with special attention on contemporary application.

#### BN302 NT Theology (2 credits)

A study of the theological message, historical background, and the development of the New Testament. Attention will be given to the unity and diversity of New Testament theology.

#### BN320 New Testament Introduction (1 credit)

A study of the historical background and canon of the New Testament, an evaluation of New Testament criticism, and an examination of special introductory problems of selected New Testament passages.

# Theology and History Courses

### TT103 God, Revelation and Commission: Doctrine and Practice I (2 credits)

A study of creation and the Triune God, the Bible and revelation, the doctrine of creation and ecological crisis, revelation and the priestly kingdom. Deepen the practice of prayer in the Commission and proclaim the Triune God in the world.

#### TT104 Christ, Man and Salvation: Doctrine and Practice II (2 credits)

A study of creation, the Fall, the covenant between God and human via the Scripture, church history and faith practice. Through studying the life and work of Christ to grasp the meaning of His office, atonement and resurrection, and their meaning to faith practice and spiritual growth.

## TT204 The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit: Doctrine and Practice III (2 credits)

A study of the person of the Holy Spirit through the Doctrine of Trinity, the work of the Holy Spirit from the OT and NT and church history, baptism of the Spirit and the experience, the charismatic movement and spiritual gifts. To deepen prayer life, spirituality, church growth and strength.

#### TT205 Contemporary Church: Doctrine and Practice IV (2 credits)

The Spirit unite believers with Christ via the symbols of baptism and communion. Local church inherits the kingdom through sacrament, Word, ministry and fellowship of the saints; with elders and deacons to govern and fulfill the Commission. Through doctrine, church history, and evangelism, practice Christian life with a holistic view.

#### TT301 Christian Ethics (2 credits)

A study of the biblical and theological foundations of ethics, and the applications of ethical principles to modern issues such as divorce and remarriage, homosexuality, abortion, euthanasia, lying, death penalty, and politics.

#### TH101 World Church History I (2 credits)

A study of world church history from early church fathers to the Reformation. Through persecution and rise of heresies, the church developed doctrines, organization and the councils after Constantine. Emergence of the Holy Roman Empire and the Monastic orders, the great schism in the church, Crusades, Scholasticism, and Humanism lead to the Reformation. (online course)

#### TH102 World Church History II (2 credits)

A study of world church history of the Post-Reformation period. The Reformation gives rise to Counter Reformation. Then come the Enlightenment, Puritanism, Rationalism, Revivalism and Missions. The world mission, Liberalism, Colonialism, Communism and Capitalism gradually move the Western Church away from the center, and bring in the global Christian Church of the 21th Century. (online course)

#### TH201 Chinese Church History I (2 credits)

A study of the origin and development of Christianity in China, from the Nestorians in Tang dynasty, Tersa (Yelikewen) in Yuan dynasty, the Catholics in Ming and Qing dynasties; arrival of Morrison, and the spread of the Protestant churches up to the rise of Communist China. (online course)

#### TH202 Chinese Church History II (2 credits)

A study of the development and revivals of Christian Church in China from the rise of communism to 21st century, showing the wonderful works of God and the challenges the churches facing. (online course)

## TR301 Christianity and Chinese Culture (2 credits)

A study of the transformation of the Chinese culture and society, and the impact of Christianity. Topics include the intrinsic characteristics of Chinese culture, the impact of alien cultures on the structure of Chinese mind and society and how and what Christianity may contribute to China.

#### TH303 Israel-Palestine Conflicts (2 credits)

A study of the Israeli-Palestinian conflicts and UN resolutions since 1948, the politics of Middle East, the theology of promised land and OT law, and human rights. What should be the response of Christians?

#### TR304 The Three Monotheism (2 credits)

A study of the rise of Judaism, Christianity and Islam, their canons, sects, strifes, beliefs and cultures, the impact of modernity and politics upon them. The response of 21st century Christian will be discussed.

#### TT203 Apologetics (2 credits)

A study of biblical apologetics, mainline apologetic approaches in the past, apologetic issues facing Christians such as cults, the existence of God, the problem of evil and suffering, and modern ideologies.

## **Ministerial Studies Courses**

#### MB101 Leading Bible Study I (2 credits)

A course on methods on studying Bible, applying and teaching it, to enable students to effectively lead a bible study group or teach Sunday school so that the life of their participants may change. An OT historical book will be used for practice.

#### MB102 Leading Bible Study II (2 credits)

Advanced course on methods on studying Bible, applying and teaching it, to enable students to effectively lead a bible study group or teach Sunday school so that the life of their participants may change. An OT prophetic book will be used for practice.

#### MB201 Expository Preaching (3 credits)

Through lectures, practice and evaluation, students may master the basic principles of expository preaching, and learn to put Bible study based on main theme, context into sermons chapter by chapter. Topical sermon, OT historical book and NT Gospels will be used for practice.

#### MB202 Preaching Practice (2 credits)

Advanced course on Expository Preaching. OT poetic and wisdom books, NT epistles will be used for practice. Students may be arranged to preach in assembly meetings.

#### MM101 Evangelism (2 credits)

This course is to equip students and provide opportunities for evangelism. The principles and various methods for effective and holistic evangelism will be examined and evaluated.

#### MM302 Church Planting (2 credits)

A study of the biblical model of church planting, the needs of Chinese in cities of North America, the link between planting and growth, and the practical strategies in implementing church planting.

#### MP204 Pastoral Ministry (3 credits)

A study of the roles and ministries of pastors and leaders from theological and practical considerations of calling and dynamics in church meetings, liturgies, visitation, weddings, funerals, spiritual direction and administration.

#### MP206 Mental Health and Pastoral Care (2 credits)

A study of the mental problems like depression, suicide among Chinese, and their cultural factors and hindrance to treatment. The focus is on the interaction of environment, DNA and brain function, and how pastoral care can be used to counsel and build up mental health.

#### MP207 Servant Leadership (2 credits)

A study of the 7 core values of servant leadership: love, humility, service, courage, cooperation, integrity and excellence. Topics include biblical leadership, how to be a servant leader, and leading innovation and change.

#### MP210 Church Leadership & Resolving Conflict (2 credits)

A study of effective leadership styles in church, the use of biblical principles and management concepts to deal with conflicts between pastors and between pastors and congregation, and the use of love and reason to resolve different kinds of conflict systematically.

#### MP211 Arts & Christian Faith (2 credits)

A study of the history of development of various streams of fine arts and their appreciation, the relationship between fine arts and Christianity. The purpose is to apply fine arts to church ministries.

#### MP212 Christian Counseling (2 credits)

An integration of pastoral, counseling, biblical and spiritual traditions and devise short term strategies to boost the pastoral ministry of the church.

#### IB/IT/IM Guided Study (1 to 3 credits)

An individual student may embark on a guided study, upon the consent of a faculty member, in order to fulfill a certain academic requirements.

## **Gospel Communications Courses**

All GC courses require personal laptop computer, softwares required by courses, digital camera or recorder, and video editor software.

#### GC201 Website Design I (2 credits)

A study of using Adobe Dreamweaver CS4 to design web pages. Topics include graphic design principles, HTML, JavaScript, Cascading Style Sheets, multimedia like video files, sound files, database, and Google Apps to import and export files, and an understanding of complete network system and structure. Prerequisite: experience in browsing Internet.

#### GC211 Website Design II (2 credits)

A continuation of Website Design I, with more practice and discussion on design skills to build a Dynamic Website of professional quality. Prerequisite: Website Design I

#### GC302 Images & Photoshop (2 credits)

Learn how to use Photoshop's basic functions and tools to modify images and create composite images, through hands-on learning experiences to make promotional images commonly used in churches and organizations. Along the way we will get in touch with basic color theory, graphic design trend and web communications.

### GC304 Social Media & Internet Ministries (2 credits)

A study of the trends in the mobile network, the concepts of Chinese-Western and all round integration, and its application to global mission. Usage of Apps include Facebook, Twitter, Google+, YouVersion, Church Online, QQ.

#### GC305 Internet Mission (2 credits)

A study of content, process and outcome of mission using internet. Topics include calling, use of social medias like Wechat, methods, techniques and the mission field.

#### Creative Media Progressive Courses

To train students to skillfully use multimedia and technology to produce audio files, documents, videos and documentary, and become talents urgently needed by churches or institutions. Qualified students may do internship in UChannel TV.

Equipment requirements: Apple notebook: Macbook pro/Mac Air, recording cell phone, digital camera. On-site interviews and shooting are required.

#### GC311 Print Media & Interview (2 credits)

Level 1 basic: To recognize the history and development of the media industry, learn and master topic selection, basic interviews, organizing interview materials and editing skills. Students will write an article of 1,000 words and make it into the content of a magazine page.

#### GC312 Graphic Design (2 credits)

Level 1 advanced: To master the basic principles and aesthetics of graphic design, do a group interview of an event or a person and make a report eligible for publishing. The layout design should be gorgeous, proper fonts be used, and the content is clear and readable.

#### GC313 Radio Program Interview (2 credits)

Level II basic: To recognize the characteristics and trends of broadcast media, improve interview skills, master recording methods, learn sound file editing, and other skills for making radio programs. Student will produce a radio program of more than 5 minutes.

#### GC314 Podcast Production (2 credits)

Level II advanced: To advance interview skills. master recording methods and sound files editing for producing a gospel podcast with professional standard. Student will produce a podcast program of 10 minutes.

#### GC315 Video Program Production (2 credits)

**Level III basic:** To recognize the characteristics of TV media, the basic process of TV station operation, and master the basic operating skills of photography and videography. Student will make a video of 3 minutes.

#### GC316 Documentary Production (2 credits)

Level III advanced: To identify suitable topics for research, write shooting outline, complete interviews, shooting, and editing. The whole class will complete a documentary of 10 min., up to the broadcast level of TV station.

## **Music Ministries Courses**

#### CM103 Keyboard Accompaniment I (2 credits)

Learn the basics of playing keyboard. Topics include play for finger positions and flexibility, music notations, triads, scales and arpeggios. The Hand on Fingering Practice will be used.

#### CM104 Keyboard Accompaniment II (2 credits)

Learn to improvise accompaniment for a melody using chords and their varied application. Practice songs including hymns, world music. Analysis of chords and four parts of hymns.

#### CM105 Keyboard Accompaniment III (2 credits)

Learn to improvise accompaniment for music notation with alternative triads exercises and transposing, accompaniment pattern without music sheet, and expressions.

#### CM106 Church Worship (2 credits)

A study of the background and various practices of Christian worship and its biblical foundation. Focus will be on providing training for creative leadership in worship.

#### CM107 Sight Reading & Singing I (2 credits)

Listen and sing. Practice accurate pitch, including tones, rhythm and major and minor triads, the correct method of sightsinging. Exercises include hymns and artistic songs.

#### CM108 Sight Reading & Singing II (2 credits)

A continuation of CM107. Training to memorize melody on listening - 4 to 8 section, various beat and rhythm pattern; vocal training. Exercises include Italian and Russian songs.

#### CM111 Choir Conducting (2 credits)

A study on the qualifications and attitude of choral conductor, advanced tempo and rhythm patterns, effective hand swing movement and coordination. Learn to become a trainer from being a tap person. Prerequisites: music theory and sight singing.

#### Prerequisite Courses (Bachelor credits)

#### CM101 Theory of Music I (2 credits)

A study of the rudiments of music theory to build up the ability of reading sheet music and sight singing of church choir, worship team. Topics include note and pitch.

#### CM102 Theory of Music II (2 credits)

A continuation of CM101. Strengthen the ability of reading sheet music and sight singing, and establish the musical foundation. Topics include pitch, chord and harmonics.

# Master of Theology Courses

#### **BO501 Septuagint (3 credits)**

This course will study various texts of the Septuagint. It will include an introduction to the Septuagint's origins, reception history into the Christian and Jewish communities, and its relevance to textual criticism and exegesis.

#### BO502 Jeremiah (3 credits)

In depth study of the OT book. Topics include the macro-structure of the book, Exodus motif, complaints and tears of the prophet, the discrepancies between Masoretic text and the Septuagint Jeremiah, and the significance of Dead Sea Discovery to the theory of book formation.

#### BO503 Deuteronomic History (3 credits)

The course will study the Deuteronomic History corpus which is Deuteronomy plus the Former Prophets, and evaluate if the corpus is a unified history of ancient Israel, and the purpose of the author is to show that the fate of Judah is irreversible. The theory of Martin Noth will be evaluated, revised, and applied to the understanding of Deuteronomy and the Former Prophets.

#### BO504 OT&NT Textual Criticism (3 credits)

A study of the critical apparatuses of Biblia Hebraica Stuttgartenisa (BHS) which is Masoretic text of the Hebrew Bible, and the Greek New Testament published by the United Bible Society (UBS). The focus is on applying the principles of textual criticism to the data bank of the apparatuses, and chooses from them the reliable variants to interpret the biblical text.

#### **BN501 Topics in Pauline Theology** (3 credits)

An advanced study of selected topics of Pauline theology like Christology, Justification and Sanctification, Holy Spirit, Ecclesiology, etc.

#### BN502 NT Use of OT (3 credits)

There are about 340 direct quotations of the OT in the NT, and 2300 allusions and verbal parallels. There is a definite literary and theological relationship between the two testaments. The course will study the NT authors' interpretive strategies in using the OT, the rhetorical inter-textuality and biblical hermeneutics.

#### TT501 Contemporary Theology (3 credits)

The course will study the elements for establishing contemporary theology, its relationship to Christian doctrines, its different concerns and methods, its views of trinity and its implications to the church today.

#### TT502 Language & Creation (3 credits)

This course will examine the theological language used to describe how God creates the universe out of nothing in seven days as stated in Genesis 1-2. The course will also examine the relationship between creation story and evolution science, God's good creation and natural disasters with all the ecological crisis.

#### DS601 Th M Thesis (6 credits)

The writing of a scholarly thesis stemming from research under the supervision and guidance of a faculty. The thesis should be no shorter than 30,000 words in length, and should be no longer than 45,000 words, including bibliography. Once the thesis is completed to the satisfaction of the thesis supervisor, there will be an oral examination of the thesis by a committee composed of the thesis supervisor and two other readers, at least one of whom will be external reader.

## Study Load

Students who take more than 12 credits per half year are regarded as full-time students.

Students should use their discretion in taking a suitable study load, and work at their own pace, but all course work for a degree program must be completed within the established time limit as calculated from the date of entry to the degree program.

- Three years: Mater of Theology
- Four years: Master of Divinity
- Three years: Master of Biblical Studies, etc.
- Two years: Diploma of Biblical Studies, etc.
- Four years: Bachelor of Religious Education

A student's program would be terminated at the end of the established time limit, unless an application for extended time is approved by the Academic Dean.

## Grading

Courses such as Small Group, Mentorship, and Internship are offered on a Pass/Fail basis. Such grades are not computed in the student's grade point average (GPA).

A student whose work in a course is not completed by the date set by the faculty may request an Incomplete in writing. Incomplete (I) may be granted when the student faces circumstances such as a personal illness or a family crisis. If the Incomplete grade is granted, the course work is due by the date agreed between the professor and the student. The maximum extension of due date is 3 months.

A student may drop a class within the time allowed and get W (Withdrawal). Otherwise, the grade will be Fail.

All courses with W grade, audit, or bachelor program courses are not counted credits.

A student may apply for W in the first two weeks of a course, or turn a course into non-credit audit before the course end, with fees.

In all circumstances, if a student cannot complete all the course works in 3 months after the course ends, the grade will be F.

A student who receives a C, D, or F for a course may choose to repeat it. When completed, the last grade will be used in computing the grade point average (GPA). Both grades will be kept in the Seminary's records.

To remain in good academic standing, a student must maintain a grade point average of 2.00 for each term, and a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.70 for graduation. A student has one full term to protest, in writing, any grade received.

#### **Academic Probation and Dismissal**

In the event that a student fails to meet the standards for good academic standing, he or she will be notified in writing and placed on academic probation. If a student remains on probation for three consecutive terms, he or she may be dismissed. Any student in a degree program whose grade point average falls below 1.30 for a term is subject to dismissal at the end of that term, but can continue to audit.

In the event that a student's personal conduct fails to comply with biblical principles, and fails to accept counseling from the faculty, the Seminary may advise the student to withdraw from the seminary. If the student causes disturbance to other students, the student is subject to immediate dismissal from the seminary.

#### **Transfer of Credits**

Students who have completed relevant studies in other seminaries prior to admission to ACE Seminary may request consideration for transfer of credits in writing to the Academic Dean. For credits to be granted, the previous studies must have approximately parallel course content judged by comparison of course syllabus. Each previous course must be validated by an official transcript with a grade of 2.70 or higher. The course work must have been completed within 7 years of the application for transfer credit. Courses more than 7 years have to be retaken.

Except under special circumstances, the total transferable credits will not exceed half of all the courses of the program enrolled at ACE Seminary.

#### Attendance

Students are required to attend all classes. A faculty member is under no obligations to assist a student in making up studies or assignments.

If a student will miss any classes, the student should provide the faculty member in advance a legitimate reason for the absence.

As a general rule, a student's absence should not exceed 30%. If it happens, the grade will be an F unless the faculty member consents to give the student another grade. A student's absence exceeding 50% will result in an F.

## **Graduation Requirements**

In order to graduate from the Seminary, a student must:

- Uphold evangelical belief, and have a Christian character and personal conduct consistent with Biblical principles
- 2. Complete the prescribed course of study within the time limit as outlined above
- Be in good academic standing as defined above
- Score 70% or above in the Bible exam
- Settle all financial obligations and payment of fees for graduation
- File graduation information with the Registrar
- Receive the recommendation of the Faculty and approval by the Board
- 8. Attend the annual commencement. Permission to graduate in absentia must be requested by writing to the Academic Dean

To receive the diploma due to Program Change, the student must complete all course works of the new program, submit application and fees.

## Transcripts

ACE Seminary students and alumni are entitled to receive transcripts of their completed course work. The first copy of the transcript is provided to students free of charge when they graduate. Further copies at \$30.00 each may be requested by writing to the Academic Dean. Transcripts will be sent directly to the appropriate institutions or individuals.

## Academic Honesty

ACE Seminary assumes that all documents supporting the student's admission and graduation are authentic and complete, and that all course works and examinations represent the student's own work. Violations of this trust include academic fraud, cheating, and plagiarism. Plagiarism refers to taking another's ideas or words and presenting as one's own. The students must give credit to the source of ideas and quotations in their course work.

The faculty will deal with plagiarism and cheating, with options ranging from exhortation to failure on the course work. If a student feels that he or she has been unjustly accused or treated unfairly, the student may appeal to the Academic Dean.

## Admission

Applicants should be born again Christians, ready to live for God's glory, with a teachable spirit, submit to the canonical authority of the Bible, and a heart to serve the Lord Jesus Christ. Applicants should have both the heart for ministry and the ability for graduate-level study.

The Seminary reserves the right to deny admission to any non-Christian or any individual having a theological stance which is in contradiction to the Seminary's Statement of Faith. The applicant's character as well as academic record will also be assessed. In general, applicants must have a four-year baccalaureate degree or its equivalent from a college or university that is accredited by a recognized regional or national accreditation body. Those who do not have a four-year baccalaureate degree can take credits at the same time from nearby accredited college or the Seminary until the requirement is fulfilled.

The medium of instruction for classes is Mandarin, all applicants should proficient in Chinese, including understanding, reading and writing. Reading knowledge of English reference books is preferable.

#### Admission Process

Applicants should request an application form from the Admissions Office.

An application is completed by submitting the following items:

- 1. A completed application form. Forms can be obtained from the ACES Admissions Office or through the Seminary web site
- A non-refundable application fee of \$70 (\$50 for Extension Program), \$150 for International Students (F-1 Visa)
- A copy of the college or university degree
- A full academic transcript or transcripts obtained from colleges, universities, or seminaries. These should be sent directly from the academic institutions to ACES
- Testimony of the applicant's conversion experience and the call to ministry
- Two letters of recommendation
- One recent passport photograph
- Reflection of church life and future ministry
- Financial documentation (F-1 Visa)

## **Application Deadlines**

All applications should be completed and returned to the Admission Office as early as possible. Once the Seminary has received the entire application, the Admissions Committee will review the application and notify the applicant in writing regarding admission status. If more information is needed, the applicant will be contacted. Applicants may call the Admissions Office to verify the arrival of documents such as transcripts and recommendations.

## **Bachelor Program**

All students who do not have a four-year bachelor degree will have to enroll the Bachelor of Religious Education study program until they complete all the requirements with a GPA above 2.70.

During the orientation, all incoming students are required to take a Bible placement test. Students who score below a designated level need to enroll in Bible courses of the Bachelor Program. With permission, students can take extra graduate level Bible courses instead.

All students have to pass the Bible examination before graduation.

The purpose of the Bachelor Program is to help students transit to the graduate level study at the ACE Seminary. The Program consists of non-credit Bible courses, English, and Theological Writing.

Students are required to take the English exam upon admission. Students who score below the standard may enroll in English courses. The purpose is to enable students to read the English reference work and the Bible for mastery of their study program.

The course of Theological Writing is intended for seminary students who do not have Bible College background. The purpose of the writing course is to facilitate students to write up-to-standard theological research papers. The course consists of writing skills, format requirements, and research skills.

# Registration

Students should be familiar with the catalog with regards to the core courses and electives for the completion of the study program. Attendance in any class is not permitted to anyone not registered for the class.

Registrations for any course including eight-week or twelve-week classes, small group, mentorship, intensive course must be completed via the ACES website before the deadline for registration. After the deadline, students have to contact the Registrar's Office and pay late registration fee for each course.

Registrations for field education, independent studies, and continuations should be completed in the Registrar's Office.

Tuition payment is due in full the first day of the first course. Students who do not have complete payment for courses already taken will be unable to register for the next term, receive diplomas, or have grade reports or transcripts issued.

Students with financial difficulties may apply for installment plans in writing to the Registrar's Office.

All F-1 Visa students have to register at least 12 credits of courses in every six months.

## Course Withdrawal/Changes

Students are permitted to drop a course without a grade penalty during the classes of the course. Any course dropped thereafter will be recorded with a Failing grade, or a grade in accordance with the academic policies.

After the registration deadline, students who would like to add a new course must register through ACES website and pay late registration

After registration has been completed, students may change courses through ACES website with an admin fee of \$10 for each course change.

Students who drop a course during the term may receive a partial refund of the tuition fees according to the Refund Policy.

## Program Change

Students who would like to change their study programs should apply by writing to the Academic Dean before the registration deadline for the academic year and pay fees.

#### Absence and Withdrawal

A student may petition by writing for a leave of absence up to two calendar years. An approved leave of absence secures the student's standing in the program during the leave of absence. The student has to pay a yearly continuation fee.

Students who fail to enroll for three consecutive terms without a prior approved will be considered to have withdrawn from their degree program and the Seminary. Students who have withdrawn and desire to return will need to apply for readmission through the Registrar's Office.

Students who consider withdrawing from the Seminary must apply by writing to and meeting with the Academic Dean.

Students who decide to withdraw from the Seminary must make their requests in writing to the Academic Dean and complete all financial obligations.

International students cannot apply for leave of absence, only Early Withdrawal.

## Student Life

## Life and Community

Students must attend the seminary's activities which include assembly and prayer meetings, annual dinner, commencement, choir practice, annual clean up and orientations. Students will have to learn to be a member of the seminary community, putting the community above themselves, serving others and submitting to authority.

## Assembly, Prayer Meetings and Small Group

Students must attend assembly and prayer meetings. The faculty will share and preach in the assembly, and students will participate in leading worship. Students will lead prayer meetings.

Students will be assigned a small group with a faculty member. Small groups meet regularly for prayer, sharing, counseling, discipleship, retreat and other activities. All students must attend small group meetings for credit.

#### The Student Council

The Student Council is a bridge between the student body and the seminary administration. The Council is constitutionally organized by the student body, and is administratively and financially independent. The Seminary annually appoints officers to the Council cabinet.

The Council is responsible for helping new students to settle down in California upon arrival. The Council is also responsible for organizing extra-curricular activities that foster social bonds, and promote the students' well-being.

All degree program students are members of the Council and will pay annual membership fees. The Seminary administration appoints an advisor to the Student Council to facilitate communication between the student body and the Seminary.

#### Health Insurance & Accommodation

All students are required to purchase health insurance coverage, and be responsible for their own medical and hospitalization expenses.

International students can apply for living in the dormitories. Priority is given to new students, second year students may need to be relocated. If there is no vacancy, students are responsible for their own accommodation.
