F. 試讀與除籍**1. 試讀**

- a. 學生每學期學業平均成績未達GPA 未達 2.3者，列為試讀生。
- b. 試讀生於試讀期間，其修課學分數得受限制，並應接受學業輔導。
- c. 試讀以連續兩學期為限；經連續兩學期試讀仍未改善者，予以除籍。
- d. 試讀期間，學生不得擔任學生會幹部。

2. 除籍

- a. 一學期所修科目半數以上成績不及格者。
- b. 連續兩學期學期平均成績未達GPA 未達 2.0。
- c. 修業年限屆滿仍未修畢畢業學分者。
- d. 除籍學生如有特殊情形(如重大疾病、不可抗力等)，得檢具證明申請復學，經審核通過者，得予復學一次。

G. 修正宗教學士課程表

宗教教育學士課程的設立，是為那些沒有四年本科畢業的學生，提供學士程度的課程科目，提高學術基礎，並補學分。

若學生按需要完成 61-120 個學分，成績及格，並滿足其他要求，可獲得宗教教育學士學位，並可申請進修碩士學位，或轉去其他神學院繼續修讀。

若學生已經有大專程度並擁有成績單，可以在此課程補 30-60 個學分，達到本科的要求。修讀完成且成績及格，會獲得「同等學士課程」證書，並可申請進修碩士學位，或轉去其他神學院繼續修讀。

H. 宗教教育學士減免學分規則

為了肯定學生既有的學術背景、事奉經驗與專業成就，美福神學院(以下簡稱「本院」)在宗教教育學士班課程中，提供特定條件下的學分減免制度。減免學分的核准，需經招生委員會審核並由同工會議通過，且學生必須修滿本學位所需總學分一半以上(即不少於 60 學分)方可畢業。具體規則如下：

1. 凡已獲得正式大專文憑(含副學士、專科、或同等學歷)者，可依所修課程內容與本院課程之相符程度，減免部分學分。
2. 減免範圍以與本院課程目標、內容相當者為限。
3. 減免總學分數不超過59學分，意即學生必須於本院修讀61 或以上學分，方可畢業。

4. 若學生曾參加基督教機構、教會或其他屬靈培訓中心之正式課程，且培訓符合本院標準，可減免相關課程學分。認定標準包括但不限於：
 - a. 授課教師需具備神學院碩士(或同等資格)學位。
 - b. 課程時數需達每學分至少 10 小時授課。
 - c. 學生需提供培訓機構之成績單、課程大綱及相關證明文件。
5. 若學生曾在教會或基督教機構全職事奉三年(及以上或同等時數)者，可減免部分「事奉與實習」相關學分；申請人須提交服事證明、事奉職責說明等相關資料供教務處評估核定。
6. 若學生在社會領域具有顯著專業成就或豐富工作經驗之人士(例如商業、教育、社會服務、公共管理、藝術文化、科學技術等領域)，可申請減免部分通識類課程相關學分。需提供(包括但不限)：
 - a. 工作經歷證明
 - b. 具體成就或成果證明(如獲獎紀錄、專業資格證書、發表作品等)
 - c. 其他相關佐證資料
7. 減免學分需與其專業背景高度相關，減免比例依個案評估。

F. Academic Probation and Dismissal

1. Academic Probation

- a. A student whose semester GPA falls below 2.3 shall be placed on academic probation.
- b. During the probation period, the student's course load may be restricted, and academic counseling is required.
- c. Academic probation is limited to two consecutive semesters. A student who fails to meet academic standards after two consecutive semesters on probation shall be dismissed.
- d. Students on academic probation are not allowed to serve as student council officers.

2. Dismissal

- a. A student shall be dismissed if more than half of the courses taken in a single semester are failed.
- b. A student shall be dismissed if their semester GPA remains below 2.0 for two consecutive semesters.
- c. A student shall be dismissed if they reach the maximum years of study allowed without completing the required graduation credits.
- d. A student who is dismissed may apply for reinstatement once under special circumstances (such as serious illness or force majeure), with supporting documentation and upon approval.

G. Bachelor of Religious Education (B.R.E.) Program

The Bachelor of Religious Education (B.R.E.) The program is designed for students who have not completed a four-year undergraduate degree. It offers academic-level coursework to strengthen students' foundational knowledge and help them meet degree requirements.

Students may complete 61 to 120 credit hours, depending on their academic background. Upon successful completion of all required credits and fulfillment of other graduation criteria, students will be awarded a Bachelor of Religious Education degree, qualifying them to Apply for a master's degree program at ACES or Transfer to other theological institutions for further studies.

Students who already possess a college-level education and can provide official transcripts may complete 30 to 60 additional credit hours in this program to meet undergraduate equivalency requirements. Upon successful completion, they will receive a Bachelor Equivalency Certificate, which also qualifies them to Apply for a master's degree program, or Continue studies at another accredited theological seminary.

Course Outline (Discipleship Group, Social Service, Internship, 1 credit each, other courses 2 credits each)

H. Credit Waiver Policy – Bachelor of Religious Education

In recognition of students' prior academic background, ministry experience, and professional achievements, America Evangelical Seminary (hereinafter referred to as "the Seminary") offers a credit waiver policy under specific conditions for the Bachelor of Religious Education program.

Approval of credit waivers is subject to review by the Admissions Committee and must be approved by the Faculty-Staff Council. In order to graduate, students must complete at least half of the total credits required for the degree (i.e., no fewer than 60 credits) at the Seminary.

The specific regulations are as follows:

1. Students who have obtained an official diploma from a recognized institution of higher education (including an associate degree, junior college diploma, or an equivalent qualification) may be granted partial credit waivers based on the relevance and equivalency of previously completed coursework to the Seminary's curriculum.
2. Credit waivers shall only be granted for courses that are comparable in objectives and content to those offered by the Seminary.
3. The total number of credits waived shall not exceed 59 credits, meaning students must complete at least 61 credits at the Seminary in order to qualify for graduation.
4. If a student has completed formal coursework at a Christian institution, church, or other spiritual training center, and the training meets the Seminary's standards, credits may be waived for equivalent courses. The criteria for such recognition include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. The instructor must hold a master's degree from a theological seminary (or an equivalent qualification).
 - b. The course must include a minimum of 10 hours of instruction per credit.
 - c. The student must provide official documentation from the training institution, including transcripts, course syllabi, and other relevant supporting materials.
5. Students who have engaged in full-time ministry at a church or Christian organization for three years or more (or the equivalent in accumulated hours) may be granted a partial credit waiver for courses related to ministry and practicum. Applicants must submit supporting documents, including proof of ministry service and a description of ministry responsibilities, for evaluation and approval by the Office of Academic Affairs.

6. Students who possess significant professional achievements or extensive work experience in fields such as business, education, social services, public administration, arts and culture, science and technology, or other related areas may apply for a credit waiver for certain general education courses. Applicants must provide documentation, including but not limited to:
 - a. Proof of work experience
 - b. Evidence of specific achievements or accomplishments (such as awards, professional certifications, published works, etc.)
 - c. Other relevant supporting materials
7. Credit waivers must be closely related to the applicant's professional background, and the number of credits waived will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
